		EIGHT ARRESTED IN DRUG RAID: People have been arrested and charged in connection with a drug ring after a raid of two homes in the Glenville neighborhood. Ten guns, ammunition, and drugs including cocaine, marijuana and heroin were all seized in the raid.
		RETIREMENT CELEBRATION AND PROCLAMATION: Third District Commander Thomas McCartney has officially retired. A ceremony was held for him at Cleveland City Hall. Mayor Jackson and Police Chief Calvin Williams both presented Commander McCartney with proclamations honoring his 30 year career.
